

How to Report a COVID-19 Case at UMBC

UMBC’s Contact Response Team (CRT) responds to COVID-19 reports that impact the UMBC campus and affiliate locations. To notify the CRT of a positive COVID-19 test or possible exposure, go to covid19.umbc.edu/report.

You DO NOT need to report having close contact with someone else’s close contact. Only report if YOU or YOUR close contact test positive or develop symptoms.

PLEASE REPORT A CASE IF:

You tested positive for COVID-19



If you have no symptoms, self-isolate for at least 10 days starting the date you tested.
If you have symptoms, self-isolate for at least 10 days starting the date symptoms began.

You have symptoms



Consult your primary care provider to determine if your symptoms are COVID-related. If they are, or you test positive, submit a new report so contact tracing can occur. Do not return to campus until a medical provider has determined that you do not have COVID-19.

You have been in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19



6 feet - 15 mins
in a 24-hour period

If you have no symptoms, self-quarantine for 14 days starting the date you were last in close contact with the person who tested positive.
If you have symptoms, consult your primary care provider to determine if your symptoms are COVID-related and if you need to be tested.

You have been in close contact with someone who has mild symptoms



6 feet - 15 mins
in a 24-hour period

If you have no symptoms, it's ok to go to work or to class, but continue self-monitoring and submit your daily symptom monitoring reports.
If you develop symptoms, consult your primary care provider to determine if your symptoms are COVID-related and if you need to be tested.

What does “close contact” mean?

Close contact means being within 6 feet of someone for more than 15 cumulative minutes in a 24-hour period.

SYMPTOM TRACKING

Faculty, staff, and students approved to be on campus this fall must complete UMBC’s daily online symptom tracker, seven days a week, including days that they do and do not anticipate being on campus. The form takes about 30 seconds to complete.
